

# Year 1 Plants

## Plants

A plant	A living thing that usually grows from the ground.
The main parts of a plant	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• flower</li> <li>• leaf</li> <li>• stem</li> <li>• roots</li> </ul>
5 common garden plants to identify	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Daffodils</li> <li>• Sunflowers</li> <li>• Roses</li> <li>• Pansies</li> <li>• Irises</li> </ul>

roots	Roots take in water and nutrients from the soil.
stem	The stem holds the plant up and carries the water and nutrients from the roots to the leaves and flowers.
leaves	Leaves catch sunlight to make energy.
petals	Petals are the colourful part of the flower to attract insects.
fruit	Fruit contains the plant's seeds. Sometimes humans try to grow fruit without seeds because it's easier to eat.
seed	Seeds grow into new plants.
bulb	Bulbs grow into new plants.

The main parts of a tree	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• crown</li> <li>• leaves</li> <li>• twigs</li> <li>• branches</li> <li>• trunk</li> <li>• roots</li> </ul>
5 common trees to know	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ash</li> <li>• Beech</li> <li>• Birch</li> <li>• Maple</li> <li>• Oak</li> </ul>

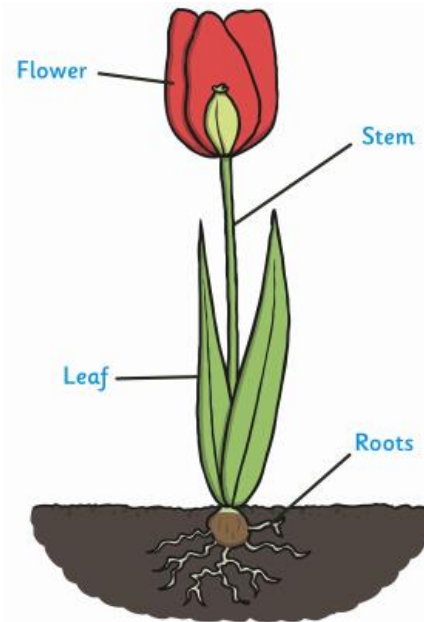


Diagram of a plant

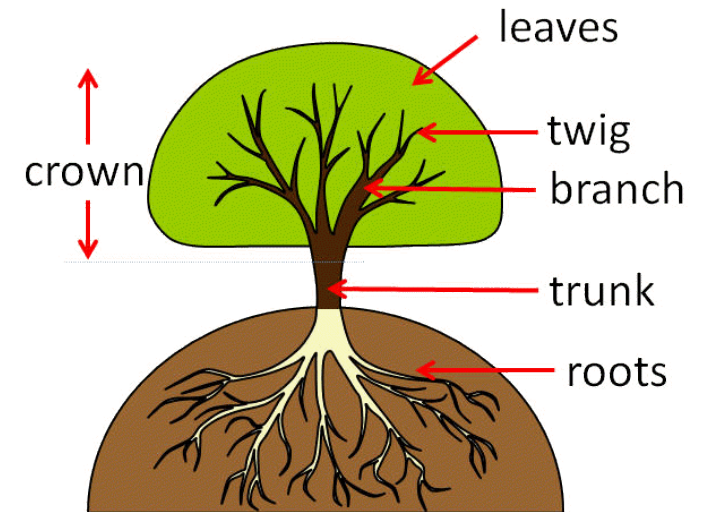
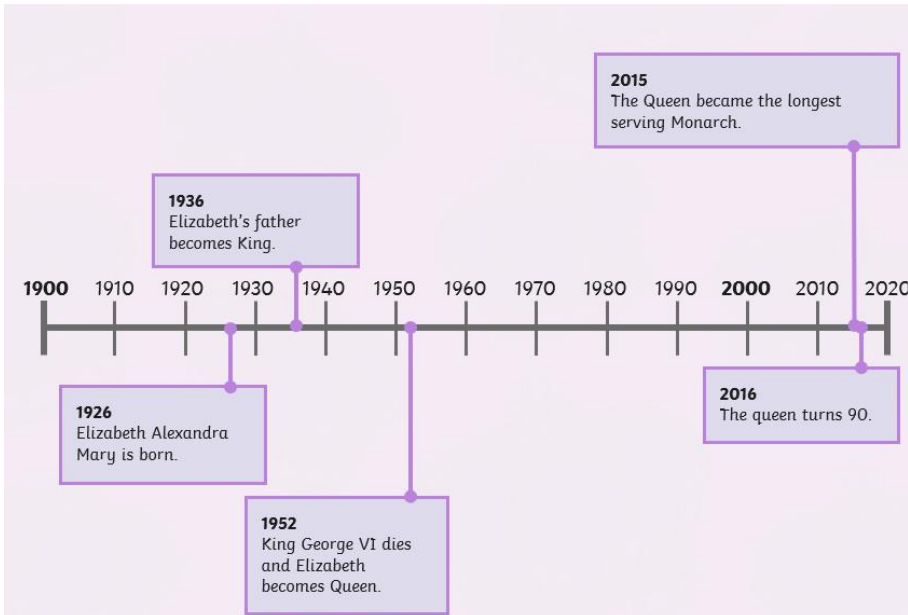


Diagram of a tree
